

THE ATTACK ON DEPUTY UNITED STATE MARSHAL HENNESSEY AT EAST ST. LOUIS.—Yesterday morning, Wm. McShaffer and Felix Reynolds, of Shipman, Macoupin county, Ill., and Edward Porter, barkeeper, St. Louis, charged with being concerned in the attack on Mr. Tom Hennessey on the previous day, at the depot of the Chicago and Alton Railroad, East St. Louis, were brought up at the office of Mr. Bowman before Judge Manners. Porter was discharged, as it was shown that he did not take any part in the affray. The two other prisoners were fined \$25 each. Mr. M. Millan, attorney for the State, prosecuted, and Mr. G. W. Davis defended the prisoners. The affair originated through a dispute about a dog, which one of the parties had sent by the Chicago and Alton Railroad, and alleged that Hennessey had got it from the conductor.
