Leon Groshon, 25, unhurt in four major Pacific landings, was shot three times by Blasingame and is in critical condition at St. Louis County Hospital. Coy Groshon, 30, his brother, suffered a slight flesh wound. Their fa-ther, Arthur Groshon, 4608 Hol-man lane, Edmundson Terrace, has retained an attorney to deter-mine whether there is basis for legal action against Blasingame.

Nation said the officer was suspended at a closed hearing of the Board of Aldermen, acting in their capacity as Police Commissioners, and that a further hearing will be held.

Blasingame, after the shooting, which took place at a Berkeley City tavern, claimed he fired in self-defense after the two, and another brother, Virgil, 21, assaulted him. The Gershons, how-
