LINCOLN, Neb., Nov. 23.—While veterans and their dependents are still waiting for the bonus, Nebraska's new veterans aid plan has been passed by the state legislature. The plan, which was introduced by Sen. George Dwyer, of Lincoln, and passed by a vote of 20 yeas and 10 nays, will be in effect by the end of the year.

The plan provides for a monthly stipend of \$100 to each veteran who is unable to support himself and his family. The stipend is to be paid for a period of 12 months, after which it will be reduced to \$50 per month.
