

HENRY BREHE FOUND DEAD AT HOME NEAR DRAKE

Henry Brehe was found dead at the home of his son, August, and family near Drake Tuesday evening. He was discovered sitting in a chair in his room when a member of the family went to call him for the evening meal. He had not complained of being ill and about an hour and a half before had been observed carrying in wood as was his habit each evening. He reached the age of 85 years and 2 months.

Mr. Brehe was born September 25, 1856, at Drake and spent his entire life on the farm where he died. He was the last survivor of the six children of the late Conrod Brehe and Amalia Buecker, being preceded in death by three sisters, Amalia Brehe, Mrs. G. D. Hilkerbaumer and Mrs. Herman Hilkerbaumer, and two brothers, Conrod and Richard Brehe.

On December 15, 1881, he was united in marriage with Anna Wehmhoener who with two children, a son, Henry, and an infant daughter, preceded him in death. Three children of this union, August Brehe, Mrs. Wm. Suenkel and Mrs. J. H. Berger, all of Route One, and eighteen grandchildren survive.

Funeral services will be conducted Friday afternoon at 1 o'clock at the home followed by services at St. James Evangelical Church at Charlotte of which the deceased was a member. Burial will be made in the church cemetery, Rev. Paul Wuebben officiating.
