

CONRAD BREHE DIES

We are sorry to report the death on Saturday, August 17, of Conrad Brehe, a lifelong resident of Gasconade county and a prominent and respected farmer of the neighborhood between Drake and Bay. Mr. Brehe had reached the age of 70 years, 7 months and 17 days. He had been ailing for about a year but was considered seriously ill for only a week. His wife preceded him in death on January 6 last.

Conrad Brehe was born in Gasconade county December 18, 1858. He grew to manhood in the county and in 1890^N was married to Miss Rebecca Buschmann at Bay. He engaged in farming all his life and was a member of the St. Paul Evangelical Church and had been a member of the Board of Trustees of this church for the past twenty years. He leaves to mourn one son and four daughters—Mrs. Emma Fox of St. Louis, Theodore, Clara and Flora at home and Anna of St. Louis. Also one brother, Henry Brehe, and two sisters, Mrs. Gottlieb Hilkerbaumer and Mrs. Herman Hilkerbaumer, of near Drake, and one grandchild. One son, Fred, died in Camp Funston in 1917 during the late war.

Funeral services, conducted by Rev. J. M. Hertel, were held Tuesday morning, from the home to the St. Paul Evangelical Church near Bay. Interment was in the church cemetery. A large assembly of friends and acquaintances were gathered to pay their last respects.
