 The New was proved by the Oath of Philip Ballantyne a Witness
 three times at about half past the 10th day of August
 1782. This New was proved further by the Oath of William
 Green a Witness three times and ordered to be read. And on the
 Motion of Ralph Green one of the Executors in the said Will
 named wife made out three and together with William
 Bacon and Richard Boden her daughter entered into and
 acknowledged Bonds as the Law directs for the same was
 granted him for obtaining a writ in due form of Law
 (being) returns for the other Executors in the Will named to
 put in the Probate where they have thought fit.

In the Name God Amen, I Seymour
 Lyman Ball: & Powell of the Town and County of York being sick and
 weak in Body but of sound mind and memory do make

this my last Will and Testament in manner following
 I Give to my dearly beloved Wife Anne during her
 natural Life all that part of my Land which lies on the
 North or North East side of the Road which runs through
 my Land Also any ten of the Negroes I do possess of
 as she may choose twenty heads of feller twenty sheep
 and as many Hogs towards the Support and maintenance
 of herself and my Children until they come to age or
 are married All which Land I have and Goods to be sold
 at her Death and the money arising therefrom to
 be equally divided between such of my Children as may
 be then living or the Supplying together here of such as
 may be married &c in the Lifetime of my said Wife
 I also lend to my said Wife the use of my House at
 the water side in York Town under she can build a
 house and purchase proper convenience on the Land
 lent to her which house are then to be sold for the most
 they will yield and the money arising therefrom to
 be divided as is hereafter directed for the other part of
 my Estate.

All the rest of my Lands Slaves and Stocks and
 to my Goods want I merchandise whatsoever to be sold.

one eighth part of the money arising from such sale as also one
 eighth part of the Oath due to my the just debts due from me to
 mine being first paid I give to my dear wife aforesaid. The
 remainder to be equally divided between my Children viz Mary
 Thomas, Clement, John, Rose, William & Jane but to be put out
 to interest on good Bonds and Security The Interest among them
 to be applied towards the maintenance and Education of my
 Children until they come to the age of twenty one year or
 married then each Child's part so arriving at the age of twenty
 one year or being married to be paid to them And if it so hap-
 pen that any of my Children die before they attain that age I name
 the part of the said in dying to be equally divided among the
 survivors.

I desire my last may be brought up to such business as my
 Wife may think proper.

I nominate and appoint my beloved Wife Anne Executrix and
 my friend David Jamison Executor of this my last Will
 to which I have hereunto set my Hand and affixed my Seal
 this 8th day of January 1776.

At a Court held for York County the 20th day of May 1782.
 This Will was proved by the Oath of David Jamison a
 single Juror. And at about half past the 10th day of
 August 1782. The said Will was further proved by the Oath of
 Thomas Gibbons another single Juror and ordered to be read.
 And at about half past the 10th day of September
 1782. On the Motion of Sam^l Powell the Executrix in the said
 Will named wife made out three and together with William
 A Rogers & William Maff her Executors entered into and acknowledged
 Bonds as the Law directs for the same was granted her for obtaining
 a writ in due form of Law being returned for David Jamison
 the Executor in the Will named to put in the Probate where he shall
 think fit.
