

DEATH OF A PIONEER

**Mrs. Molander Passed Away at
the Anderson Home Yesterday**

LIVED HERE LONG

Deceased Came to This Country in
1865 and Has Lived Here Ever
Since—Has Been Falling in Health
For Several Years and Was in
Bed Several Weeks.

A host of DeKalb friends as well as a number from other parts of the county will be grieved to hear of the death of Mrs. Christina M. Molander who passed away Sunday morning at six o'clock at the home of her daughter, Mrs. C. A. Anderson on North First street.

Deceased was born in Sweden April 14, 1825 and came to this country in 1865 with her husband. They came directly to DeKalb and she has made her home in this city ever since. Eight children were born to this union of whom six are now living. They are John Molander of Denver, Colo., Aaron Molander of DeKalb, Mrs. C. A. Anderson of DeKalb, Mrs. H. Holmgren of DeKalb, Charles Molander of North Dakota and Theodore Molander of New York. Her husband died in Denver, October 31, 1879. She also leaves seven grandchildren, Arthur and Ethel Anderson, Adolph, Wesley, Roy, Emma and Ethel Holmgren and one great granddaughter, Helen Anderson.

Mrs. Molander has been a consistent faithful member of the Swedish Lutheran church since 1869. She has been falling in health for several years but for the past three weeks has been confined to her bed. She was taken suddenly ill Saturday noon and at seven o'clock all of her children were summoned to her bedside. She made a brave struggle for life until the end came at six o'clock Sunday morning.

The funeral will be held Tuesday afternoon at the home of C. A. Anderson, 216 North First street. The home will be opened from ten until twelve o'clock Tuesday morning for the people who wish to view the remains.
