

1. Trent, Henry 1676 – before 5 September, 1726. "

Jan. 8, 1725 – **Will of Henry Trent:**

To son Henry, all my lands if he lives to 21, and if he dies, to my eldest daughter Edith Trent, if she will pay to my youngest daughter Mary Trent 6000 lbs tobacco. Wife Edith to be guardian to my children and to have use of my lands and negroes. The latter are to be divided among my three children when my son Henry is 21. My loving mother Elizabeth Gee to be paid one barrel of Indian corn per year.

Wife Edith to be executrix.

Dated 8 Jan 1725

Recorded 5 Sep 1726
