## WITT FAMILY

In the summer of 1699 more than five hundred Huguenots who had escaped from France to England, left Southampton for Virginia, where the King had given them a grant of 10,000 acres. They safely reached the shores of Virginia, where they were heartily welcomed. Among the emigrants was the Witt family.

In the will of William Witt, probated June 13, 1754, Albemarle Co., Va., he mentions his sons, Benjamin, and John and daughters, Sarah Canidey, wife of John Canidey, and Agnes Key. The will is witnessed by Henry Martin, Samuel Hopkins and John Barnet.

In deeds (1756) of Prince Edward Co., Va., Charles and Lewis

Witt are mentioned as brothers of Benjamin.

In the will of Charles Witt, probated 1782, in Halifax Co., Va., he mentions, sons, Elijah, Caleb and Joseph Witt, daughters, Sarah Kerby, Lavinia Sullins, Mary Jonaker, Charity, Nelly Lydia, Rhoda and Susannah Witt. Wife Lavenia, Witnessed: Micajah Watkins and Robert Bakestrow.
