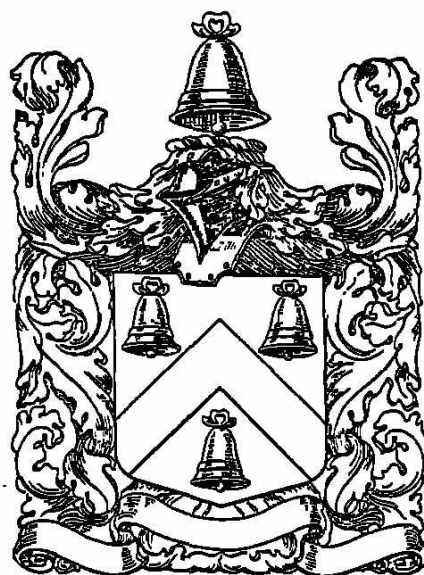


Beall

FIELDER MONTGOMERY MAGRUDER BEALL, Major, U. S. A., *b.* 19th May, 1849, at Beltsville, Prince George's Co., Md.; *m.* (firstly) 16th June, 1879, at Philadelphia, Pa., Martha Anna CLARKE, *b.* 17th Apr. 1857; *d.* 29th June, 1900; dau. of Thomas Levitt and Margaret (SUMMERS) CLARKE, both deceased; *m.* (secondly) 19th Sept. 1901, at Mill-edgeville, Ga., Anne Lawson MAPP, *b.* 6th May, 1876, dau. of Frank (deceased) and Mary (SCOTT) MAPP of Atlanta, Ga.

- I. Lillie Clarke BEALL, *b.* 11th May, 1880; *m.* 24th Sept. 1901, Thomas Clayborn FROST, of San Antonio, Texas, son of Col. Thomas Clayborn FROST, late of Confederate States Army.
- II. Grace BEALL, *b.* 16th Apr. 1885; *m.* 1st Sept. 1909, Lieut. George T. EVERETT, U. S. A., *b.* 3d May, 1886, son of Dr. Lawrence T. EVERETT of Laurinburg, N. C.

MAJOR FIELDER MONTGOMERY MAGRUDER BEALL, 28th U. S. Infantry. Graduated from the school of the U. S. Weather Bureau, 1870, and successively operated the meteorological stations at Rochester, N. Y., Philadelphia, Pa., and New York City. Commissioned Lieut. in the U. S. Signal Corps, 1883. Graduated from the U. S. Signal School at Fort Myer 1884, and assigned to meteorological work in Washington. Transferred to the 5th U. S. Infantry, 1890. Promoted to the 18th U. S. Infantry, 1891, and served in Texas until the Spanish-American War. Ordered to the Philippine Islands 1898, and commissioned Captain in the 3d U. S. Infantry. Participated in engagements with Philippino Army at San Roque, Baliuag, Maasin, Ill Defonso, San Miguel, Cane Break and Bintoc. Wounded in the fight at Bintoc. Served in 1905 and 1906 in northern Alaska, and made successfully the now famous march across Alaska, from Delta River to the Coast at Port Valdez, without a mishap. Commissioned Major 1906, and assigned to the 28th Infantry.
