Mary Catharine Spicer, dau. of Hiram Louis Spicer, M.D., by his wife, Mary Catharine Scharf, a sister of Col. John Thomas Scharf of Baltimore, Maryland.

EDWARD CULVER of New London, Connecticut; b. 1610, in England; d. 1685; the Puritan; member of Massachusetts Bay Colony, at Boston, 1635; founder and landed proprietor of Dedham, Massachusetts, 1636; extensive landowner in New London, Connecticut, 1652-85; soldier in King Philip's War, 1675-76; lived at the head of the Mystic River in New London County, Connecticut, on his estate which abutted upon that of Governor Winthrop; m. 19th September, 1638, Anne Ellis at Dedham, Massachusetts.

EDWARD CULVER of Litchfield, Connecticut; b. 1653, in New London, Connecticut; d. 7th April, 1732; soldier in King Philip's War, 1675-76; Member of Committee to establish the bounds of the "Volunteers Lands" in Windham County, Connecticut, in 1705; a Surveyor by occupation, and a Lieutenant in command of Connecticut Scouts in 1712; Founder and original Proprietor of Lebanon, Connecticut, in 1698-99; original Proprietor of Litchfield, Connecticut, in 1721; m. 15th January, 1682, at Norwich, Connecticut, Sarah Backus, b. 1663, dau. of Lieut. William Backus, Jr., b. 1639, d. 1721, Proprietor of Norwich, by his wife Elizabeth Pratt, b. 1642, d. 1730, dau. of Lieut. William Pratt, d. 1678, of Hartford and Saybrook, Connecticut, by his wife, Elizabeth Clark, dau. of the Hon. John Clark, b. 1608, d. 1674, of Saybrook and Milford, who was one of the grantees named by King Charles II of England, in the Connecticut charter of 1662.
