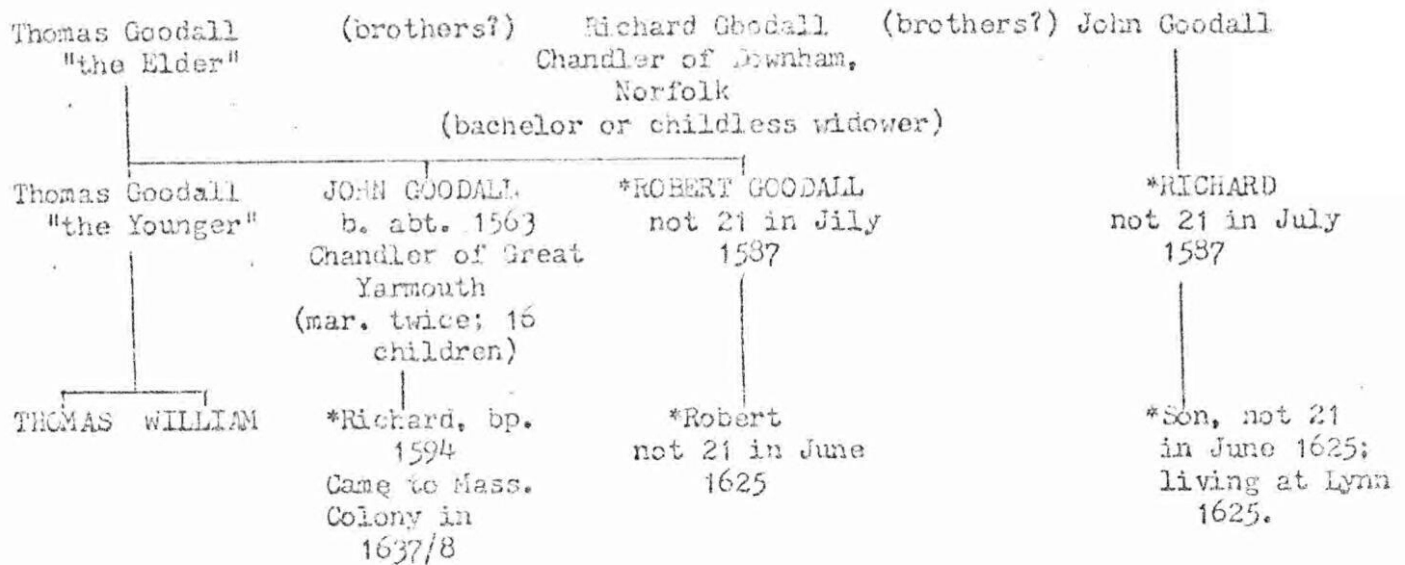


# SUMMARY CHART



(Names in caps. received bequests in Richard Goodall's will.  
\*Mentioned in John Goodall's will)

Note: An Elizabeth Goodale died in Eng. in 1601 and named in her will:

"Sons George, John, Robert, and William

Daus. Alice Kilham and Margaret Downing and their husbands, Henry Kilham and William Downing.

Grdch.: Alice Kilham and Margaret Downing and 'the three oldest children of my son William, one to twenty years.'" (Boston Transcript, 6239.5)

## Questions:

Was Elizabeth Goodale (above) the wife of Thomas "the Elder" or of Arnold Goodale (See Dennington Parish Records, p. viii)

Was she the grandmother of Richard and Robert Goodale and Austin Kilham, all of whom came to Mass. Colony? If not, why was her will noted in The Boston Transcript?

Was the Robert Goodale (ell) who came to Mass. Colony in 1634 the one noted in the above chart as the son of Robert, son of Thomas the Elder, or was he Robert, son of Robert and Joan Goodall as shown in the Dennington Parish Records, p. viii? Were they one and the same person?

Were the three Thomas Goodalls above the same as the Thomases of Earlestoneham? (See Report of The College of Arms., p. ii)

It would seem as though these people were all related one way or another, some identical to others, if the thread of similarity could just be unraveled. The Boston Transcript No. 9830 states that Robert brought to America the arms granted Thomas Goodall of Earlestoneham.
