

Howell¹ Williams, Lord of Ribour, m. Wenlion, dau. of Llyne ap Jevan of Rady and had son Morgan.

Morgan² Williams of Lanishen, Glamorgan, m. Joan Batton, dau. of Thomas of Glamorgan, and they had Thomas³ and Jevan.

Jevan³ Williams m. Margaret, dau. of Jenkin Kemeys of Bagwey Man. They had William⁴ Williams of Lanishen, Bailiff for Henry VIII, who (wife not known) was the father of Morgan⁵ Williams of Lanishen, Glamorgan, and later of Putney, Surrey ale brewer at Putney, Wansworth and Greenwich, for Henry VII and VIII, and the husband in 1494 of Katharine⁵ Cromwell (*Walter⁴, John³, William², Robert¹*). They had a son Sir Richard⁶ Williams, b. about 1495.

Sir Richard⁶ Williams, alias *Cromwell*, m. in 1518, Frances Murfyn, dau. of Sir Thomas Murfyn, Lord Mayor of London in 1518. He d. at Stepney in 1547, and was buried in Gt. St. Helen's Church, London. He left a son Henry⁷ Cromwell, alias Williams.

Sir Henry⁷ Cromwell, alias Williams (called "the Golden Knight") of Hinchbrook, Huntingdon, m. Joan, dau. of Sir Ralph Warren, Lord Mayor of London, and they had: Sir Oliver,⁸ Robert, Henry, Richard, Philip, Joan, Elizabeth, and Frances.

Robert⁸ Cromwell of Huntingdon, brewer, m. Elizabeth Stewart, widow of William Lynn of Bassingbourn, and their fifth child was Oliver⁹ Cromwell, "*The Lord Protector*."

Robert's sister, *Elizabeth⁸ Cromwell*, m. William Hampden of Great Hampden, Bucks, and among their children were John⁹ Hampden, "The Patriot," and Richard Hampden.

Thomas³ Williams (*Morgan², Howell¹*) of Lanishen, Glamorgan, d. at St. Helens, Bishopgate, London; was buried in the church there "with his brass on stone." He m. (1), — Daniel of Edmonton, Midd.; and m. (2), Margaret —; her brass on stone. He had a son John⁴ Williams.

John⁴ Williams, steward of Wimbledon Manor, Surrey, m. Margaret Smyth, dau. of Richard Smyth, and grand-dau. of Margaret Cromwell (see *ante*). He d. at Mortlake in 1502, and she in 1501. They left two sons, John⁵ and Richard.

John⁵ Williams, b. in 1485; m. Joan Wykys, dau. of Henry Wykys of Bolleys Park, Chertney, and sister of the Elizabeth Wykys who m. Thomas Cromwell (brother of Katharine) secretary to Henry VIII, Lord Cromwell of Oakham, Earl of Essex.

Richard⁵ Williams was b. in 1487, at Rochampton. He settled at Monmouth and Dexton, Mon., where he d. in 1559. He was twice
