was from Marlborough, Wiltshire, England and migrated on the James of Southampton in 1635. He was a constable in Haverhill in 1652. Birth is estimated as 1603, based on age at depositions. The Great Migration notes that it seems likely there is a connection between Thomas Davis and James Davis, of Gloucestershire and who also immigrated to Newbury and ultimately Haverhill, but does not prove or disprove this connection.
