- ii. ELEANOR, b. 1598, Eng., m. 1st, John Adams who d. 1633, Plymouth; m. 2nd., June, 1634, Kenelm¹ Winslow, b. 1599, Eng., d. Salem, 1672; "Ellen the widdow of Kenelme Winslow was Buried the 5th of december. 1681. being 85 years old" (See Mayfl. Desc., Vol. 2, p. 250.) "Landmarks of Plymouth" says "John Adams m. Eleanor Newton who came in the Ann, 1623." "John Adams and Eliner Adams" shared in the division of cattle that came in the Ann (Mayfl. Desc., Vol. 1, p. 157.) Kenelm Winslow m. her as Ellen, wid. of John Adams. Was she called Ellen because the first wife had also been named Eleanor? She had at least, one son, Kenelm³, m. Mercy Worden.
- iii. Peter, b. 1609.

Peter<sup>2</sup>, Worden (Peter<sup>1</sup>), b. 1609, Eng., d. between Jan. 9, 1680, date of will, and Mar. 3, 1681, date of proving, m. Mary Sears, or Winslow, b. 1610, Eng. d 1687.
