

WELL KNOWN WOMAN DIES

**Mrs. Charles A. Anderson
Passes Away at 5:00 o'-
Clock Last Evening.**

Following a brief illness, her condition not becoming serious until a few weeks ago, Mrs. Elida Anderson, age 76, widow of Charles A. Anderson, for many years one of DeKalb's leading business men, died at 5:00 o'clock yesterday afternoon at the Glidden Memorial hospital. Mrs. Anderson, who resided at 216 North First Street, had been ill but a short time. Two weeks ago, when her condition became worse, she entered the Augustana Hospital, in Chicago. Sunday she was brought to DeKalb and became a patient at the Glidden Memorial Hospital.

Mrs. Anderson had been a life-long resident of DeKalb and played a most active part in the growth of this community. She was very active in the First Lutheran church, participating in its organization. Mrs. Anderson became a member of the church on May 16, 1880, through confirmation. Throughout the community she leaves many friends to mourn her death.

Born in DeKalb.

Mrs. Elida Susanna Molander-Anderson was born in DeKalb on August 10, 1865, attending the schools of this community. On December 10, 1884, she was married to Charles A. Anderson of this city, Mr. Anderson, who for many years was in the hardware business in DeKalb, passed away October 3, 1930. One son, Arthur Anderson, passed away April 21, 1926.

Mrs. Anderson is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Paul Franzen of Chicago, one granddaughter, Mrs. Helen Coots of Stevens Point, Wis., one great-grandson, Jackie Coots, one sister, Mrs. Hilma Holmgren of this city, and two brothers, John Molander of Denver, Colo., and Henry Theodore Molander of this city.

The funeral services will be held on Saturday afternoon at 3:00 o'clock from the Nelson & Ronan Mortuary, the Rev. E. W. Magnusson, pastor of the First Lutheran church, to conduct the service. Interment will be in the family lot in the Evergreen cemetery.
